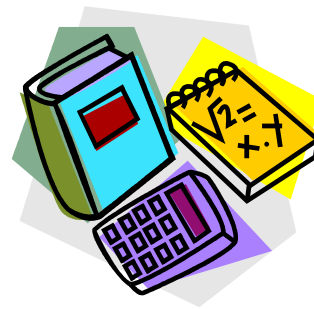


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Welcome to Statistics Honors

Student's Responsibilities

Bring to class daily:

- A 3-ring binder with paper for notes
- A PENCIL for classwork, quizzes and tests
- Homework composition notebook – **to be collected & graded at random.**
- A **graphing calculator – TI-83 or TI-84 (regular or plus)**
 - DO NOT BUT ANY OTHER BRAND, for example, Casio. You will be given very specific directions in class that only work with the TI-83 or TI-84.
 - **The graphing calculator will be used every day.** It is **mandatory** for tests, quizzes and class work

Attendance

If you are absent:

- I will provide you with the class notes, but it is **your** responsibility to ask for help if you don't understand them.
- You are expected to make up any test, quiz or assignment as per rules stated in the school handbook.

Lateness

- You must be seated & ready to work when the bell rings.
- We work from bell to bell.
- Being late to class will cause you to miss work.

Homework

Statistics is not a spectator sport. You cannot master Statistics by watching others. You must participate and practice Statistics homework assignments since homework reinforces concepts learned in class and helps you develop positive study habits.

- Homework is assigned & reviewed daily.
- Your homework notebook will be collected and graded at random. **Bring it to class every day!!**
- **You must show all work to receive credit.** A paper containing only the answers will not be accepted.
- You are expected to correct your homework once it is gone over in class. This may require you to take notes and rework some problems at home, rather than just copy answers from the teacher's overheads.
- If absent the day your HW notebook is collected, you may hand it in the next day without losing any credit.
- If you do not have your notebook on the day it is collected, you may hand it in the next day for half credit. Handing it in any days after that will result in a grade of a zero.

Quarter Grade Calculation

- Tests, quizzes, and projects – 75%
- Performance Assessments (homework notebook, video guides, etc.) – 25%
